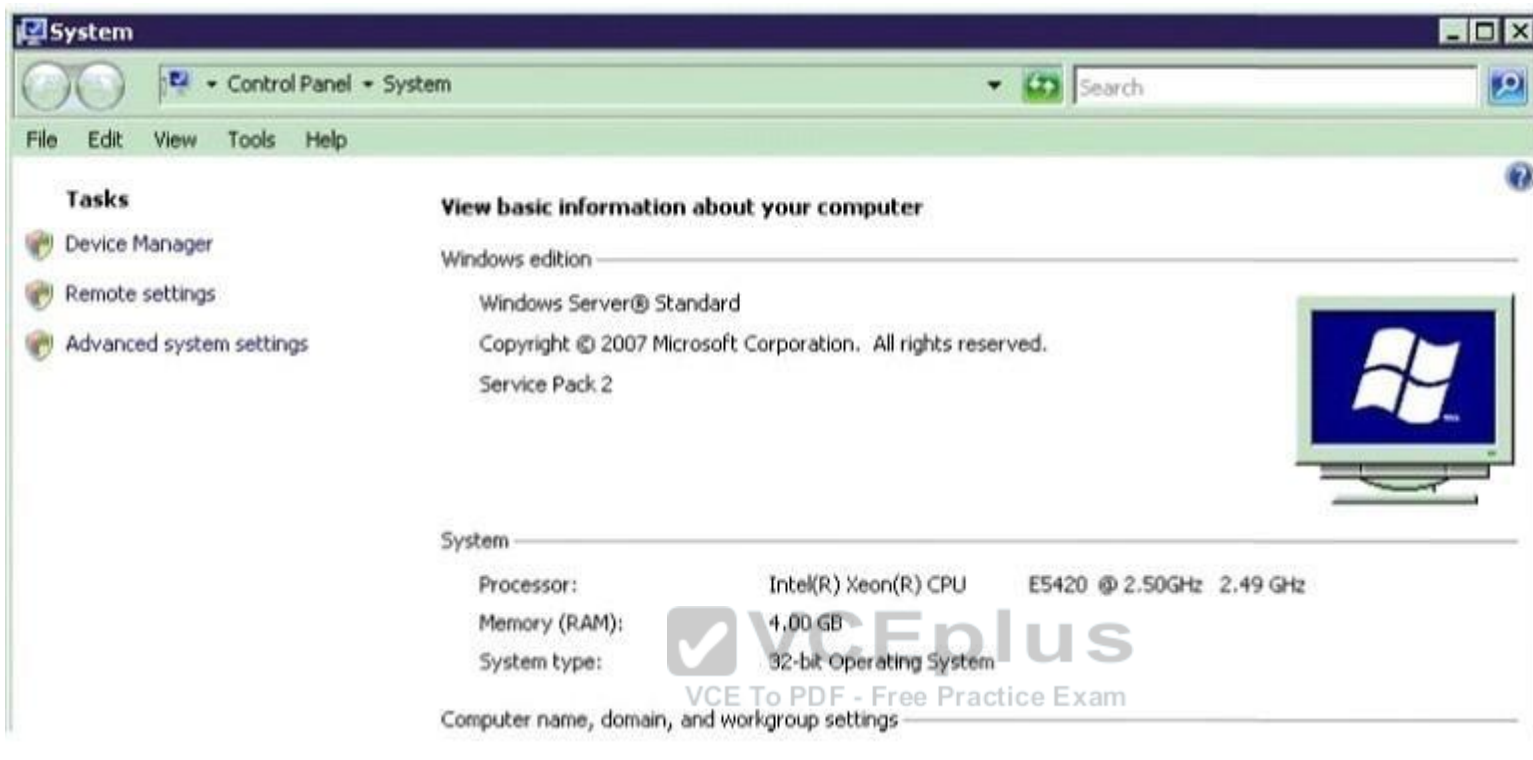

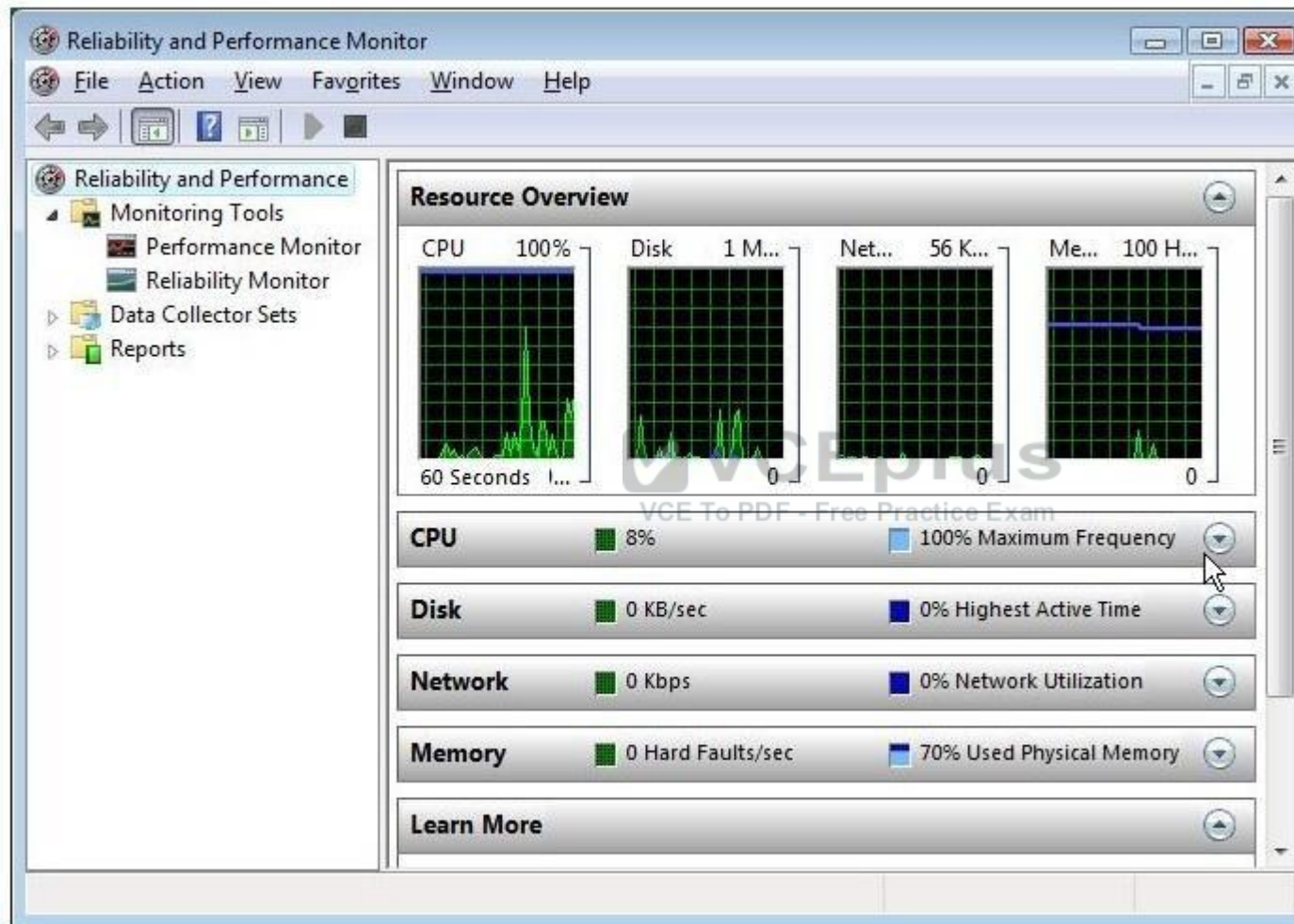

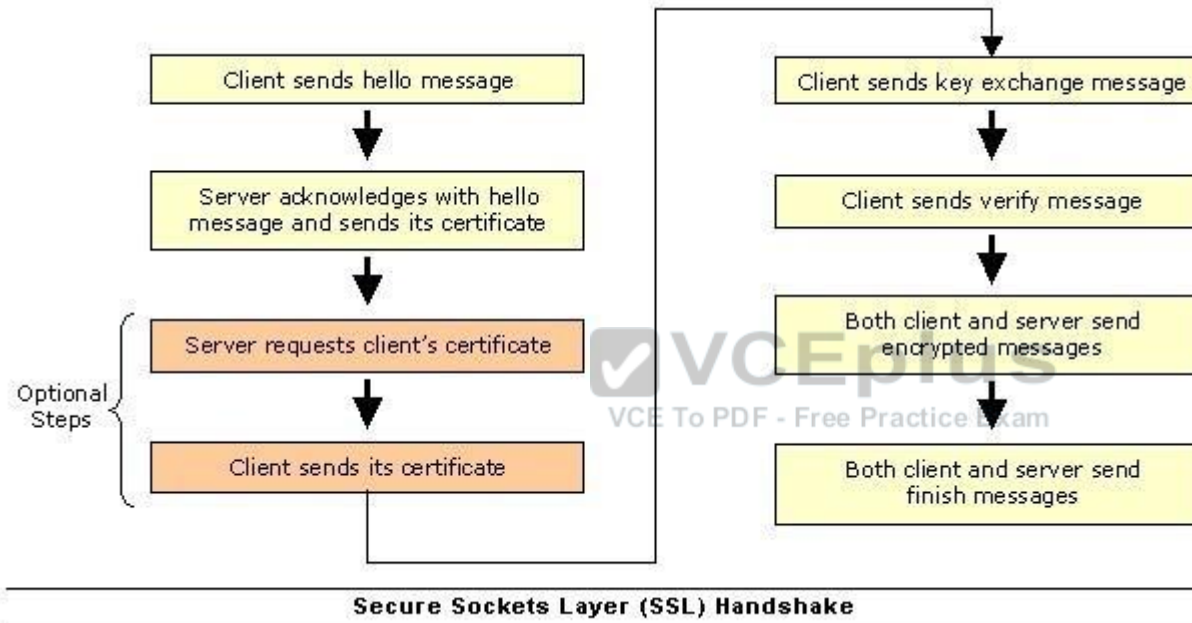

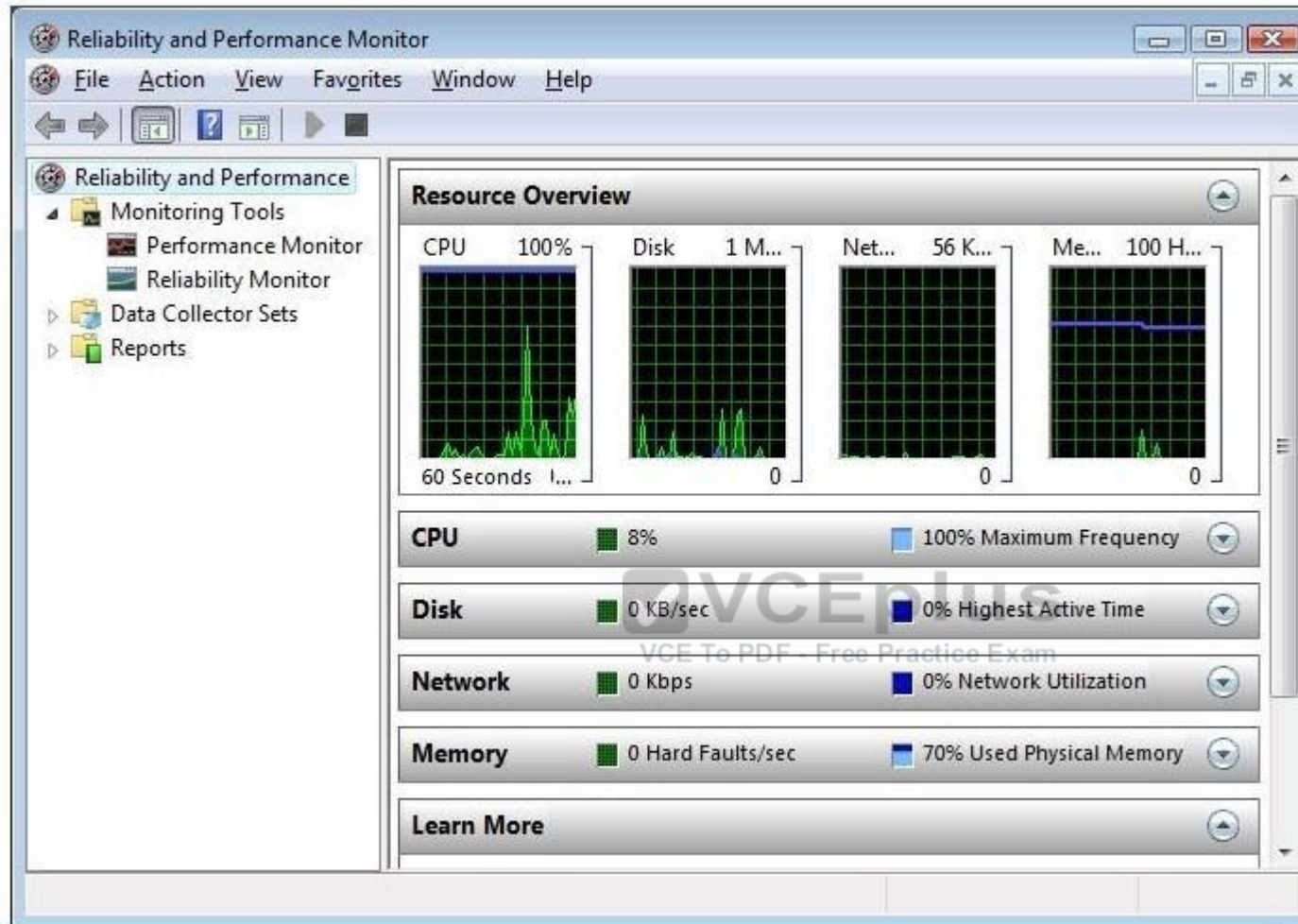

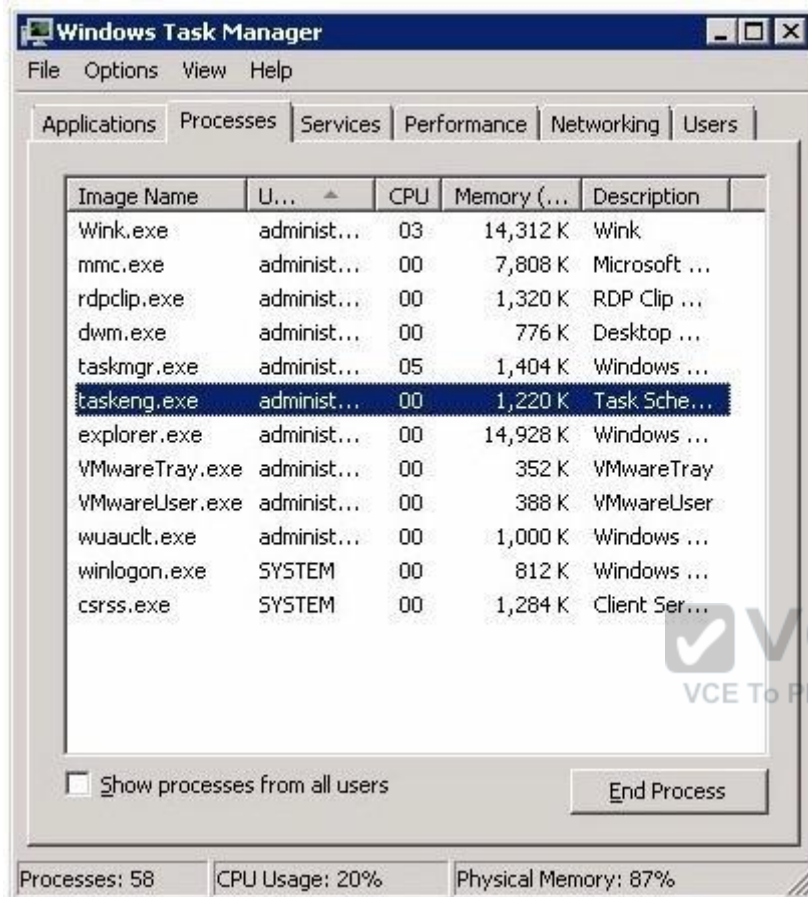

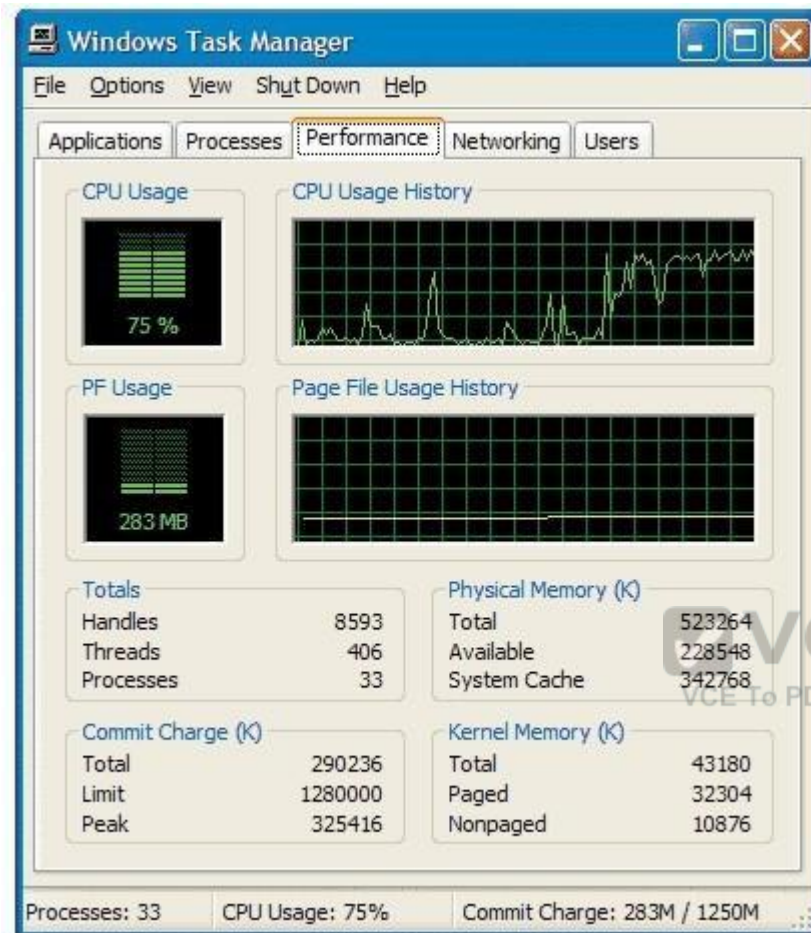

5.Restore a GPO: In the GPMC Group Policy Object node, right-click the GPO that a user wants to restore, and click Restore From Backup. In the Restore Group Policy Object Wizard, select the backup location and the source GPO, and then finish the wizard.

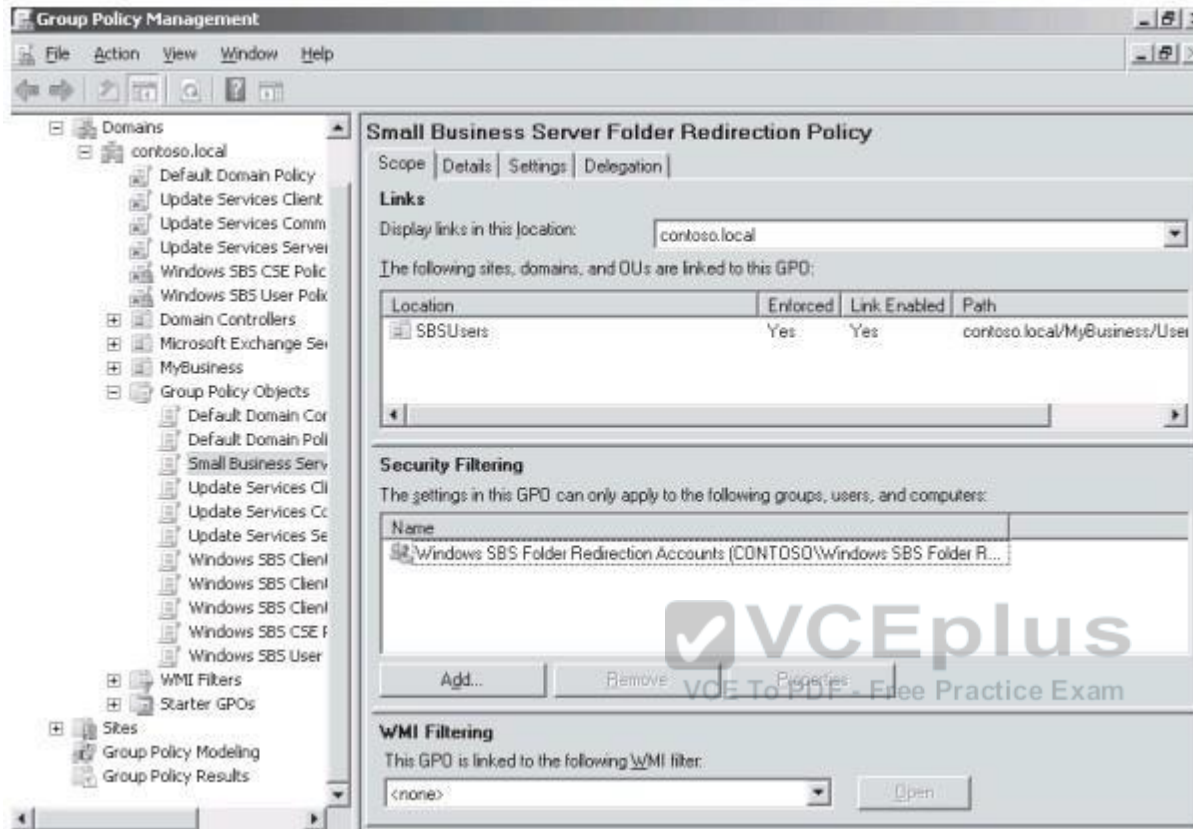

All communications with the WCF service happens via the endpoints. The endpoints also define a binding that specifies how a client will communicate with the service and the address where the endpoint is hosted.

Otherwise the WCF service can be hosted in IIS, or it can be self-hosted in any process by using the ServiceHost class, which is provided by WCF. 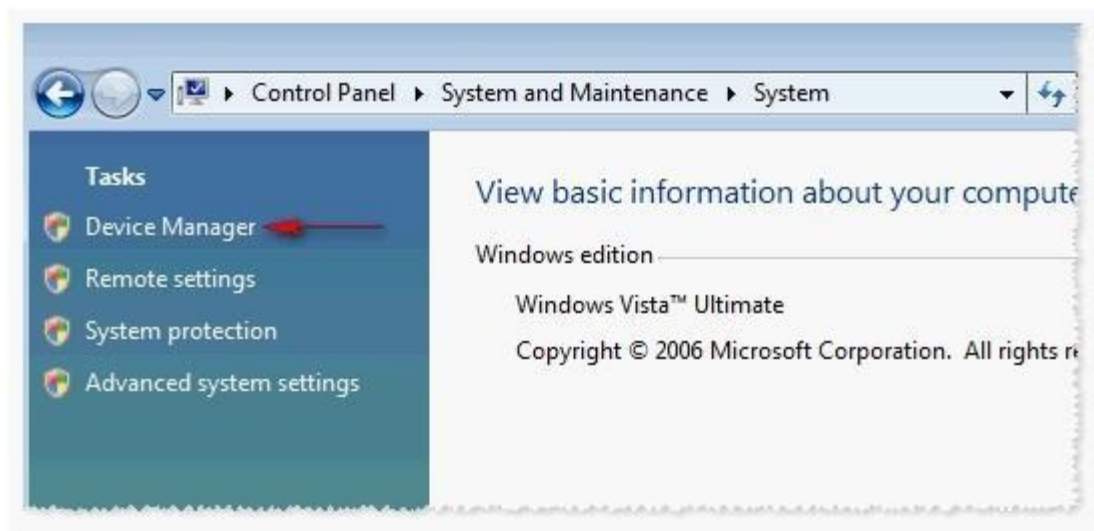
